

THE EIGHTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT OF FLORIDA
ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 11.22

IN RE: GERALD OLIVER MARTIN

Whereas, pursuant to the authority of Article V, section 2(d), of the Florida Constitution, Fla. R. Jud. Admin. 2.215 and section 43.26, Florida Statutes, the Chief Judge of the circuit is authorized to administratively supervise the circuit and county courts in the circuit; and

Whereas, it has become known to the Court that GERALD OLIVER MARTIN, having been previously trespassed from the Gilchrist County Clerk of Court's Office, on June 14, 2018, did disrupt the safe and orderly administration of justice by making verbal threats in the presence of Gilchrist County Sheriff's Office personnel indicating, due to his dissatisfaction with rulings made in his case, it was his intent to go to the Gilchrist County Courthouse and become an active shooter until law enforcement killed him; and that thereafter said GERALD OLIVER MARTIN was taken into custody pursuant to the Baker Act and a Risk Protection Order was entered; and

Whereas, on or about June 19, 2018, said GERALD OLIVER MARTIN did repeatedly make verbal threats to do bodily harm to a hearing officer and expressed dissatisfaction with a judge, as reported to the Court by UF Shands Psychiatric Hospital;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the aforesaid authority and factual basis, and to set forth requirements regarding the lawful admission of GERALD OLIVER MARTIN into any courthouse located within the Eighth Judicial Circuit of Florida ("the courthouses"), it is

ORDERED:

1. GERALD OLIVER MARTIN is **prohibited from entering any courthouses located within the Eighth Judicial Circuit** except to conduct lawful business. The lawful business of GERALD OLIVER MARTIN in any Eighth Judicial Circuit courthouse is limited to his appearance at a scheduled court event in which he is a party and reasonable access to the offices

of the clerk of court to file papers in any case in which he is a party, subject to the conditions set forth in paragraph 2.

2. If GERALD OLIVER MARTIN appears in any courthouse located within the Eighth Judicial Circuit on lawful business, he shall be escorted by a deputy to the place within the courthouse where he may discharge his business lawfully. He shall remain under escort by a deputy for the length of time necessary to discharge his lawful business, and shall then be escorted out of the courthouse.

3. If GERALD OLIVER MARTIN enters any courthouse located within the Eighth Judicial Circuit for any reason other than for lawful business, he may be issued a trespass warning by court security personnel. If he then enters the courthouse again for any reason other than for lawful business, the trespass warning which was issued against him may be executed, and GERALD OLIVER MARTIN may henceforth be subject to arrest for violation of the trespass warning.
