

THE EIGHTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT OF FLORIDA
ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 11.21

IN RE: GERALD E. MOBLEY

In order to provide for the requirements of the Eighth Judicial Circuit regarding the lawful admission of Gerald E. Mobley into the Alachua Family and Civil Justice Center and the Alachua Criminal Justice Center (“the courthouses”); and

Pursuant to the authority of Article V, section 2(d), of the Florida Constitution, Fla. R. Jud. Admin. 2.215, and section 43.26, Florida Statutes, which authorize the Chief Judge of the circuit to administratively supervise the circuit and county courts in his circuit; and

It having become known to the Court that Gerald E. Mobley, a self-represented litigant with multiple circuit civil cases, has disrupted the orderly administration of justice, including but not limited to threatening to “arrest” one of the judges of this circuit; it is therefore


ORDERED:

1. Gerald E. Mobley is prohibited from entering either the Alachua County Family and Civil Justice Center, 201 East University Avenue, Gainesville, Florida, or the Alachua County Criminal Justice Center, 220 South Main Street, Gainesville, Florida, except to conduct lawful business. The lawful business of Gerald E. Mobley in either courthouse is limited to his appearance at a scheduled court event in which he is a party, and reasonable access to the office of the clerk of the court.

2. If Gerald E. Mobley appears in either courthouse on lawful business, he shall be escorted by a deputy to the place within the courthouse where he may discharge his business lawfully. He shall remain under escort by a deputy for the length of time necessary to discharge his lawful business, and he shall then be escorted out of the courthouse.

3. If Gerald E. Mobley enters either courthouse for any reason other than for lawful business, he may be issued a trespass warning by court security personnel. If he then enters the courthouse again for any reason other than for lawful business, the trespass warning which was issued against him may be executed, and Gerald E. Mobley may henceforth be subject to arrest for violation of the trespass warning.
