SUSPENDING EXECUTION OF WRITS OF BODILY ATTACHMENT

WHEREAS, the outbreak of COVID-19 has caused a public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, The Governor of the State of Florida has declared a state of emergency; and


WHEREAS, The Florida Supreme Court has directed the Chief Judges of the Circuits to adopt procedures for mitigation of the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the court must fulfill its responsibility to protect the health and well being of the public;

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. This Order shall take effect at 12:00 noon on April 8, 2020 and shall continue through 12:00 midnight on May 29, 2020.
2. The execution of Writs of Bodily Attachment in Department of Revenue, Child Support cases, is SUSPENDED throughout the Eighth Judicial Circuit.
3. Law enforcement agencies within the circuit are directed to not make arrests pursuant to any Writ of Bodily Attachment in Department of Revenue, Child Support cases.
4. Writs of Bodily Attachment remain active and valid, and may be executed on or after May 30, 2020.
