Pursuant to Administrative Order 11.25, weekday court events March 30th through April 17th are as follows:

***Alachua County Criminal Justice Center (CR 1A)**

- Alachua County First Appearance cases (9:00 am). Cases in which Defendant is arrested on a warrant or capias from another jurisdiction shall be administered pursuant to AOSC20-17.
- A Criminal Emergency Docket (10:00 am) addressing “Essential Court Proceedings” in Alachua County criminal cases (circuit and county court). “Essential Court Proceedings” are defined as: Bond Hearings, In-Custody Changes of Plea, and other matters which the Court determines to be of an urgent nature. ***These cases must be approved and coordinated with the office of the Judge assigned to the case.***

****Alachua County Family and Civil Justice Center (CR 2D)**

- Juvenile Detention Hearings (8:30 am)
- A Family/Civil Emergency Docket (9:00 am) will take place immediately following Detention Hearings and Preceding Shelter Hearings addressing “Essential Court Proceedings” in all Alachua County family and civil cases (circuit and county court) and all family and circuit civil cases in Baker, Bradford, Gilchrist, Levy, and Union Counties. “Essential Court Proceedings” are defined as: Appointment of Emergency Temporary Guardian, Vulnerable Adult Injunctions, Adult Protective Services Proceedings, “Do Not Resuscitate” proceedings, Seizure of Bodily Fluid proceedings, and other matters the Court determines to be of an urgent nature. ***These cases must be approved and coordinated with the office of the Judge assigned to the case. In the event a General Magistrate is hearing the case, it must be approved and coordinated by that office.***
- Dependency Shelter Hearings (11:30 am)
- Alachua County Domestic Violence Injunction Hearings and Risk Protection Order Hearings will be heard in a separate proceeding on Thursday mornings.
- All proceedings related to the current public health emergency, such as Violation of Quarantine, Travel Limitations, Closing of Buildings, and Curfews, will be heard by the Chief Judge or his designee at a time to be determined.

*****Regional Counties (Baker, Bradford, Gilchrist, Levy, and Union Counties)**

Circuit Criminal Judges:

- A Circuit Criminal Emergency Docket will take place addressing “Essential Court Proceedings in Baker, Bradford, Gilchrist, Levy, and Union Counties (9:00 am). “Essential Court Proceedings” are defined as: Bond Hearings, In-Custody Changes of Plea, and other matters which the Court determines to be of an urgent nature. ***These cases must be approved and coordinated with the office of the Judge assigned to the case.***

County Court Judges:

- First Appearance for Regional Counties will be held at a location to be rotated among the five counties each weekday (10:00 am). Cases in which Defendant is arrested on a warrant or capias from another jurisdiction shall be administered pursuant to AOSC20-17.
- First Appearance will include Dependency Shelter Hearings for all Regional Counties (11:00 a.m.).
- A Regional Emergency / Domestic Violence Docket will take place (11:00 am) immediately following Shelter Hearings to address Domestic Violence Injunctions, Risk Protection Order hearings, and other county court matters the Court determines to be urgent in that county. ***(Exception - No Domestic Violence Docket will take place the week of March 30th)***
